- Contact you if there is a problem with attendance, punctuality, uniform, behaviour or equipment.
- Keep you informed about school activities through ParentMail and monthly Newsletters.
- Welcome you to become involved in the daily life of the school.

As parents of the school, I/we will:

- Ensure that my/our child comes to school regularly and on time (by 8.50am).
- Support my/our child in his/her home learning.
- Listen to my child read daily and complete their reading record; ask questions to deepen thinking and understanding linked to the text.
- Read a bed-time story to my child each day.
- Attend Parents' Evenings, workshops/open days and discuss my/our child's progress, raising any concerns that I/we may have.
- Respond to opportunities to become involved in the life of the school, <u>examples</u>: attending Assemblies, coming to drama productions/music events, becoming part of or attending Parent Teacher Association events.
- Support the school when concerns regarding my/our child's behaviour are raised and work with the school in partnership to ensure that my/our child follows the school Behaviour Policy.
- Respond to Health and Safety issues raised by the school, <u>example</u>: safe and responsible parking.
- Not take my child out of school during term time.

• Notify the school if my/our child is unable to attend and the reasons for any absence.

As a pupil of Dosthill School, I will have pride in myself and my school by:

- Attending school regularly.
- Bringing all the equipment needed every day.
- Wearing the school uniform and being proud of my appearance.
- Completing all of my class work with pride so that it is the best of my ability.
- Being respectful, polite and helpful to others.
- Walking through corridors silently, calmly and sensibly in single file so everyone is safe.
- Following the rules in the dinner hall.
